

RCI Ontario Chapter Breakfast Seminar

On February 28, 2014 the Ontario Chapter held a breakfast seminar at the Brampton Golf and Country Club. The 35 people in attendance enjoyed a hot breakfast buffet followed by presentations on "Roof Scanning and Membrane Monitoring" and "Building Envelope Transitions".

The first half of the seminar featured Jason Teetaert, P.Eng of Structural Monitoring Technology presenting the various sensors, monitoring systems, and scanning methods that can be used for verification and reporting purposes. Real life practical applications, installation details, site conditions, and monitoring results were showcased.

For the second half of the seminar Mark Doerrsam of Niagara Commercial Coatings provided some real life examples of problems associated with building envelope transitions from a contractor's perspective. Issues often arise relating to coordination of trades during construction. The solution to these issues is often to "leave a flap", which can lead to continuity problems at transitions.

Both portions of the seminar were well received and were both entertaining and informative. Those is attendance received 3.0 continuing education hours (CEHs).
